Never too young to make a difference: EMILY ABATECOLA

From the moment you sit down with Emily Abatecola, her passion for YMCA Camp Campbell cannot be contained. A veteran of Camp Campbell's very own Science Camp and Summer Resident Camp, the 14-year-old is quick to chat about her lifelong camp friends and favorite counselors, eagerly show off the different rags she's earned through the YMCA Ragers Program, and recount fond memories, like the time she sent her arrow straight through a target apple on the archery range.

The experiences were eye-opening for Emily, who commented that Camp instilled the Y's four core values in her and taught her to set goals to better herself. "It's truly changed the way I look at things - you get back what you put into the world."

Yet, it wasn't her own experience that led Emily to become one of our youngest and most dedicated donors.

During her second summer attending resident camp, Emily met two new friends with whom she hit it off right away. The three of them soon became inseparable and, to this day, she considers them her best camp friends. But it wasn't until the end-of-the-week that they confided in Emily that they were foster kids and what their week together at Camp Campbell had meant to them.

As Emily recalled, "They had some pretty bad times growing up because of feeling undervalued. They felt like they were being used and sometimes worried about their safety."

"They told me that they really loved Camp and that it felt more like home than their actual homes," she continued. "They felt included and not as different. It gave them time to just be a kid and not worry about serious things, and then they could go back to their normal life thinking more clearly."

After that experience, Emily came home both thankful for the love and support she receives from her own family and inspired to help provide similar experiences to other kids less fortunate than herself.



With the help of her mother and sister, Emily decided she would start making lip balm that she would give away as an incentive to any person who donates \$3 towards Camp Campbell scholarships for foster kids. With four varieties of flavored homemade balm and a supportive network of friends, family and schoolmates, Emily's idea truly took off. Before she knew it, she had raised enough money to send two kids to camp!

And she's not done yet. Even though her transition into High School has brought many new demands, Emily is determined to continue fundraising and is already thinking of other types of homemade goodies she can create to encourage people to donate.

She also dreams of becoming a Camp Campbell counselor when she's older, and then possibly a teacher, so that she can help kids and form the kind of mentoring relationships that have had such a profound impact on her life.

Despite the remarkable efforts Emily is making to "pay forward" her experience at Camp Campbell, she remains a bit embarrassed by all the attention. It's clear that she's truly embraced the values and lessons taught year-after-year at camp. Because as Emily says, with the same matter-of-fact fashion as a seasoned donor four times her age, "I just wanted other kids that were less fortunate than I to be able to go to camp."

Your support made it possible for 6,733 low-income youth to participate in one of the Y's youth development programs.

Working together to raise student achievement:

As her son, Jake, was finishing up his Kindergarten year, Alejandra became concerned about his educational development. Jake was reluctant to participate in class and Alejandra worried whether he was making enough progress with his reading. She also knew that if he started falling behind, it'd become even tougher for him to catch up.

Unfortunately, that's exactly what is happening to too many students today. Locally, almost half of all children are currently performing below grade level, and with each year that passes, these struggling students are more likely to fall even further behind their peers. The greatest academic losses can be seen during the summer months, when numerous children – particularly those from low-income families – lack access to regular educational activities.

But thanks to the generous donations received through our Annual Campaign and grants from a number of charitable foundations, the YMCA of Silicon Valley has been able to address this growing problem through our Summer Achievement Program.

This past summer, the YMCA of Silicon Valley proudly offered this program to approximately 500 elementary school students at seven school sites in low-income, underserved communities. Because of the generous financial support received by the Y, the cost to families is minimal, ranging from \$0 to \$50 per week.

Through our Summer Achievement Program, children participate in a full day of educational activities – including 2½ hours of instruction from a credentialed teacher – that are designed to increase literacy, improve math and science skills and enhance character development. The program also boasts a low 8:1 student-to-staff ratio and features engaging teaching techniques, like the use of the “Raz-kidz” program on Google Chrome Books, to keep the children eager to learn.

Of course, it's not all work and no fun. Throughout the week, children also have the chance to participate in a wide range of traditional summer camp activities, Friday field trips to local attractions and daily rallies full of camp songs, skits and ceremonies that celebrate students' accomplishments. In addition, nutritious meals are served every day, which help ensure that the children remain healthy and ready to learn.



Alejandra immediately saw the impact that the program had on her son: “Jake has made significant progress both academically and socially. His reading level has improved from basic to Proficient! Socially, he has gained the confidence to let his voice be heard ‘loud and proud!’ I can’t say enough good things about this summer program and how proud I am that Jake was able to be part of it.”

The stats are compelling. An evaluation conducted in 2013 found that first grade students who participated in the program gained an average of 4.3 months in their reading assessments and second grade students gained 3.7 months. Even more telling, every single participant reported that the program helped them become more excited to learn.

The results were just as apparent to the teachers involved in the program. “The YMCA has found a way to make sure students gain – not lose – what they’ve retained from the school year AND to prepare them for the beginning of the upcoming school year,” commented Del Roble Elementary School teacher Regina Pryor. “Ninety-three percent of the students in my class made progress in their reading scores. Numbers like these are unheard of!”

It's those stats, and the many stories of lives that have been touched, which keep Y leaders enthusiastic about what the future holds for the program.

“There is such a tremendous need to ensure that all children, regardless of income, have the opportunity to continue to learn and develop during the summer months,” said Mary Hoshiko Haughey, VP of Operations for Youth Development and Social Responsibility. “With the continued support of our generous donors and partners, we hope to bring this program to even more students in the summers ahead.”

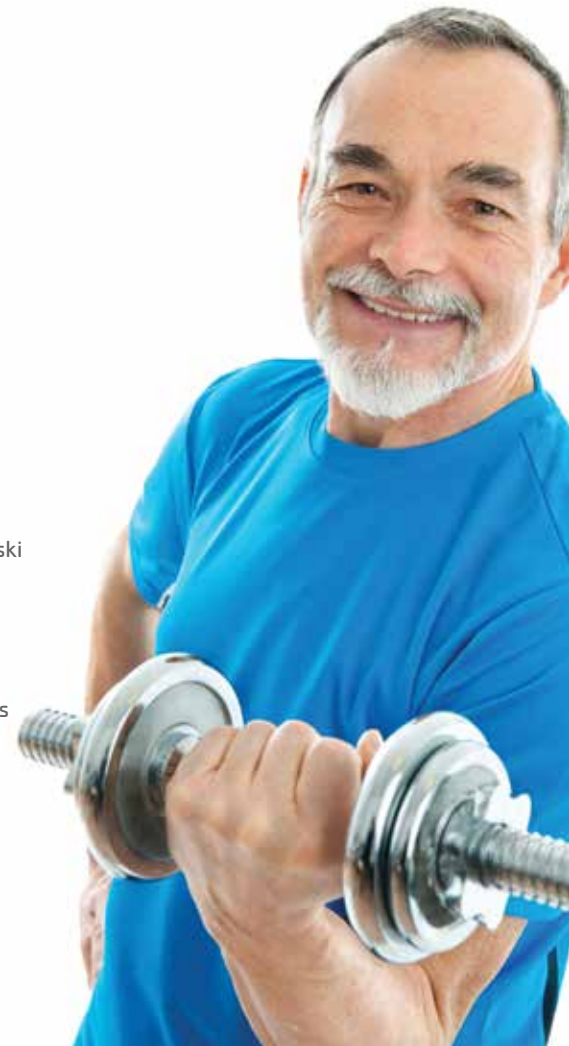

A legacy of giving: JOE BELL

You've probably heard the story about the "viral vet," Joe Bell, who was filmed in his World War II uniform cheering on runners during the Pat Tillman Foundation's 408 Race to the Row. But the part of the story you probably do not know is Joe Bell's deep connection with the YMCA.

Don't let his age fool you. Despite being well into his 90s, Joe bikes the five blocks between his house and Central YMCA in order to swim laps and water jog in the indoor pool. After his swims, you can find Joe sitting on the couch in the hallway talking to staff and members alike. His memory still sharp as a razor, he will regularly ask, "Do you want to hear a quickie?" and go on to recount stories from his time training paratroopers with the OSS in Italy and North Africa, or joyriding on a motorcycle at the age of 14.

But for Joe, a longtime Central YMCA member and donor, the Y is much more than just a place to swim. When he is asked why he gives so generously to the YMCA, he will say, "It's for the kids."

Born in China in 1919, Joe spent many years of his youth at the Shanghai YMCA. "It was so hot in my hometown of Tsing Tao, we would go swimming in the local YMCA pool," before proudly adding, "I played water polo and I could swim 100 yards in a minute."

Joe still sees the Y having that same kind of positive impact on kids today. He owns the house next door to Central YMCA where the Central Nursery School is located and for years has watched the kids walk over to the Y for swim lessons and to splash in the pool.



He also fondly recalls the smiling faces of summer campers and then goes on to describe what can only be described as an epic game of tug-of-war.

"One day, a group of campers had just returned to the Y when the bus driver got out a heavy long rope and said to all the boys and girls that they were going to play tug-o-war. When they started playing, the girls were losing. But as parents came to pick up their kids, a bunch of the mothers came up behind the girls and started helping them tug. Then, as the boys started to lose the game, some weight lifters going into the Y came out and started helping tug for the boys. How much fun!"

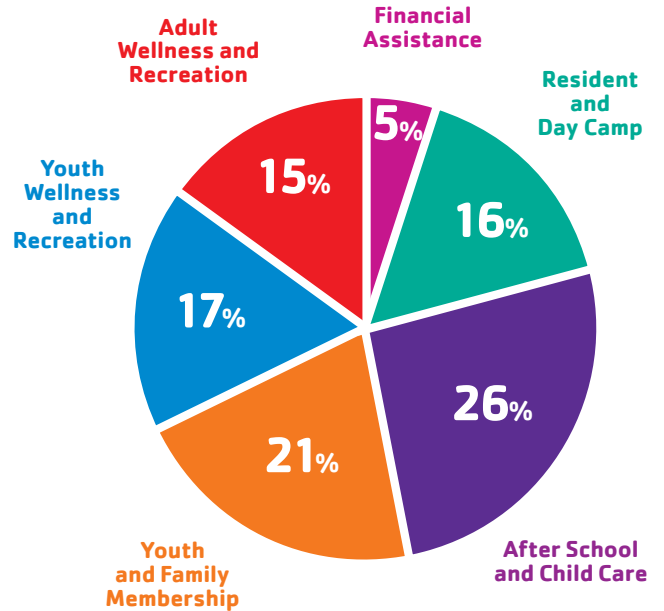
