You will write a riddle on each piece of paper and place them throughout the house(make sure you keep the kids/student in one place so they do not know where you hid the clues) 2. You will hand the first clue to the kids/students and the scavenger hunt begins 3. Each clue/riddle will lead them to the next clue/riddle 4. The final clue/riddle will reveal the incentive
	Active	<p>Hands on-engagement, demonstrate and practice skills</p> <p>The scavenger hunt activity allows kids/students to practice problem solving in a physical form. This helps kids/students act- out methods and practice problem solving in a way they might not know they are learning. This activity also helps with memorizing and working towards a goal.</p>

Focus	Specific time and attention on skill development	This activity will take about 35 minutes to 50 minutes depending on how many people are participating and how fast they solve the clues/riddles. This activity will help the child/student develop problem solving skills, reading, building team work, while keeping them active.
